<u>Liz Merson</u>

- ReadySLO update
- Accelerated Stage Two
- Focused on testing and contact tracing
- Transferring auxiliary services back to non-profits as they begin to open back up
- Closing safe parking, but still providing showers
- Waiting on summer school and recreational sports guidance
 - Protests are impacting the COVID-19 response
 - o Have slowed down the state timelines

<u>Dr. Rosen</u>

•

- Two updates on SNFs, RCFEs, and Hospitals:
 - 1. Change in visitation restriction
 - Narrowing these restrictions
 - Facilities determine own guidance
 - 2. Helping SNFs do baseline testing
 - Test all employees and residents by the end of the month
 - Help with ongoing surveillance testing

<u>Dr. Beebe</u>

- Tenet Health has a 200 per day test capacity
- Waiting for reagents for the panther which can provide a ~300 per day capacity
- Data entry would be the limiting factor after that

Maya Craig-Lauer

- Currently working on 20-21 HPP grant
 - Will send out any relevant information from the grant to partners
- The Medical Reserve Corps has grown quickly because of this incident
 - Working to manage volunteers to support testing sites and for Alternate Care Site Readiness

<u>Liz Merson</u>

- Optum (contracted by the State) testing site moved to SLO the week of June 8th
 - o Remains at Grover
- Partnership with US Health Fairs
 - Testing in Cambria (June 1-2) and Los Osos (June 3-4)
 - Testing in Atascadero (June 17-18)
 - \circ $\,$ Oceano and Nipomo planned for week of June 22^{nd}

<u>Vince Pierucci</u>

• Protests:

- o One in Nipomo
 - ~100 people
 - Going well
- Tonight at courthouse in SLO
 - ~2500 people
 - Starts at 5pm
 - Organized by the NAACP
 - Protesters will most likely go on a march
 - Police are going to take a more measured approach (guide protests away from critical infrastructure.
- o Tomorrow:
 - Protest in San Luis Obispo
 - Protest in Grover Beach
- Has been informing hospital CNOs
 - Communicated with hospital security
- o SNFs are identified for law enforcement
- Marion requested 10 ventilators
 - Case count in Santa Barbara still growing

<u>Brandy</u>

- Were supposed to get a COVID-19 positive patient (a parolee who needs psychiatric treatment) but was able to get them diverted
- They feel prepared to isolate them as they arrive
- Disease is likely to spread in the facility if introduced

<u>Emma</u>

- Question: Update on the situation in Mexicali?
 - Over past month, cases have increased in Imperial County
 - \circ $\,$ Many people with dual citizenship coming across the border for care $\,$
 - o 77 COVID-19 patients between 2 hospitals
 - Set up a 125 bed Federal Medical Station
 - Transferring patients out
 - Mostly by helicopter and some fixed-wing
 - Yesterday, they only transferred out 5, which is down from 10-12 per day average
 - This number may not be accurate, as some may not have been reported at the time of this meeting
 - We have not accepted any
 - The situation may be stabilizing
- The SWMHE (State Wide Medical Health Exercise) is cancelled for this year, which is normally the week before Thanksgiving)

• Was planned to be a pandemic influenza scenario.
