What is a Green Gardener Program, and why is it Imperative to San Luis Obispo County?

The Green Gardener Program is a bilingual (English/Spanish) curriculum that educates and certifies local gardeners in resource efficient and pollution prevention landscape management practices. Green Gardener students receive instruction in landscape practices that examine complex issues such as landscape irrigation efficiency, low maintenance landscapes, green waste reduction, watershed health, fertilizer management, pesticide reduction, and much more. This is only the beginning; with an ever-increasing population, limited natural resources, and a degrading environment, it is increasingly important to pursue environmental responsibility within urban areas.
