## MISSION STATEMENT

Our mission is to investigate and, where appropriate, prosecute those public officials or public employees who commit crimes relating to their official duties. Such crimes may include violations of the Brown Act, Political Reform Act, Elections Code or Penal Code. The Public Integrity Unit is intended as an adjunct to, but not to duplicate or interfere with, the work of the Fair Political Practices Commission.

## REVIEW PROCESS

- 1) All complaints must be in writing (mail or e-mail);
- 2) The complaint must allege a crime;
- 3) The subject of the complaint must be a public official or employee of a public agency;
- 4) The complaint must provide sufficient evidence to justify further investigation;
- 5) The complainant must disclose if the complaint has been referred to any other agencies whether federal, state or local;
- 6) The complainant cannot be anonymous.

## CASES ACCEPTED

- 1) Brown Act violations;
- 2) Conflicts of Interest involving a public entity or public agency;
- 3) Election violations;
- 4) Improper use of public funds (Penal Code §424);
- 5) Embezzlement of public funds/property (Penal Code §504);
- 6) Residency issues for:
  - a) False candidacy papers;
  - b) Perjury;
- 7) Any case that, in the view of the District Attorney's Office, supports the mission of the Public Integrity Unit.

NOTICE

**Your submission to the San Luis Obispo County District Attorney’s Office may become part of a police report. Every person who reports to the District Attorney’s Office, or other police agency, that a crime has been committed and knows the report to be false, is committing a crime and can be prosecuted, (Penal Code §148.5).**
